Leaders/Facilitators

Matt Nink is the executive director of Global Youth Leadership Institute, based in Milwaukee, WI. He has conducted workshops in several schools throughout the US and internationally. Most recently he conducted a series of workshops on collaborative leadership in three cities in India: Delhi, Bangalore, and Mumbai.

Kim Bouldin-Jones is a board member and institute coordinator of Global Youth Leadership Institute. She has led GYLI programs in the US as well as in Costa Rica. She is a counselor and teacher at John Burroughs School in St. Louis. Kim is also the director of her own non-profit organization, Medical Facility Aid, which is working to improve hospital conditions in Ethiopia, including building a new facility that will serve 7 million people.

M. Imroz is a trainer/facilitator for Global Youth Leadership Institute, and she is originally from Hyderabad, India. Her travel includes India, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Pakistan, Cambodia and USA to work with organizations, schools, teachers, youth and children especially in areas of people and communities living in conflict covering major issues such as leadership, community development, and experiential & outdoor education.
